All new employees with the Center must complete a training curriculum, background check and orientation. All employees are expected to participate in a rotating on-call schedule for 24-hour response. Applicants must have an educational degree in related field or equivalent work experience; valid driver's license; insured and reliable transportation and willingness to travel; a commitment to and understanding of issues surrounding violence; flexible schedule; and excellent interpersonal, verbal and written skills.

The Domestic Abuse Specialist is a full-time position and will be responsible for providing education to civic organizations, religious groups, employees/employers and others on the topics of violence prevention. In addition, the Specialist will provide advocacy; ongoing support; 24 hour-response; medical, legal and personal advocacy; support groups and access to other needed resources in the community to survivors of domestic abuse and their significant others (children and adults).
